The district has hired Autumn Weber to work with the elementaries as a literacy specialist. She will assist with Individual Reading Improvement Plans. She will help put the IRIP's together and work with teachers and families to implement strategies for reading. The students who will qualify for this fall below the 50th percentile. Hemmeter will use recent AIMSweb scores (K) and NWEA scores for 1-3 grade to determine who would need this service. This is in response to the new reading laws put into place stating all students should be proficient in reading by third grade. We are looking forward to having her on board to navigate the law and give us any input we need.
