Strategy 1:

Instruction for all students - Students will be presented and taught pre-writing strategies including how to create graphic organizers and paragraph support techniques to strengthen the writing skills of students. Grading the essays will be done by a rubric that focuses on pre-writing first and then the ideas of the essay, organization throughout the paper and word choice. Staff will use the 6 + 1 writing process along the AXES writing process.
