Parent-Teacher Conferences

Our second Trimester ends on February 20th. Report cards will be sent home with students the following week. Parents may also access report cards through Skyward Family Access. Parent-Teacher Conferences will be held on March 2nd and 3rd from 4:00-6:00. Due to the limited time, teachers will request to meet with parents on an "as needed" basis. Parents may also request a conference.

Indoor or Outdoor Recess?

We follow the guidelines on page 16 of the STCS Elementary School Student and Family Handbook: Students will stay indoors when temperatures are below 10 degrees (F.) or 10 degrees with wind chill. Since there are often many days in the year where weather conditions do not permit children to have outdoor recess, we provide an indoor recess for students.

We would like to offer a variety of options for indoor play, but are discovering that some students do not have experience playing with board games or other indoor games. It would be wonderful to have parent volunteers come in to teach students how to play various board games. If you are available and your schedule is flexible so that on any given day you would be able to help out, please contact the principal.

Saginaw County Road Commission Reminders for Student Safety:

- While waiting for the school bus, stand away from the edge of the road. Keep your eyes open for plow trucks.
- Wear bright, visible clothes and stay back far enough so the plow driver can see you.
- Do not build forts or tunnel into piles of snow along the roadways and driveways.
- Keep sleds and toys away from roadways at all times.
- Be EXTRA CAREFUL when walking near the roadway when road surfaces are slippery.

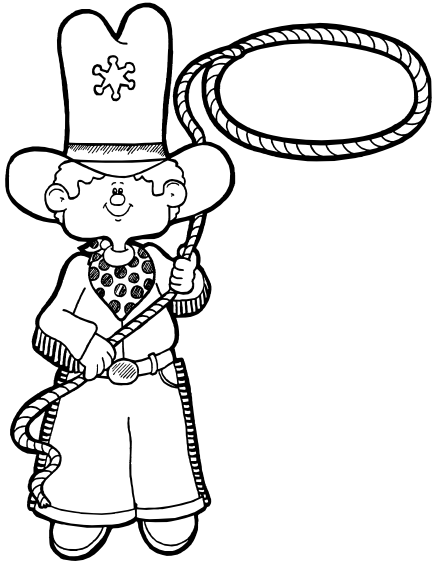

Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS)

Improving student achievement is our utmost priority. In our MTSS model for school improvement, we focus on positive behavioral expectation and support as well as reading and math instruction and support. We have established school-wide expectations for student behavior and positively reinforce students as they demonstrate the expected behavior. All students are screened in reading and math skills three times a year. Those students needing additional assistance are provided with additional support and their progress is monitored frequently. Our school-based leadership team utilizes a data-driven, problem-solving process to help all students achieve academic success with appropriate social skills. Our collaborative team approach includes the expertise of classroom teachers, literacy/numeracy specialists, instructional assistants, special education personnel, and social workers. If you have any questions about the services provided for students, please contact the principal.

Children who are 5 years old by September 1st are eligible to enroll in Kindergarten or the Young 5 Program.
