Principal's update: Jim Bailey reported:

Our 1-5 classrooms are all doing NWEA testing right now. This test is used 3 times per year. NWEA is different from MSTEP. MSTEP evaluates our programs and how they work as a whole. Data is not used to diagnose specifics for each student, it's for the school as a whole. NWEA assesses the individual student. This data tells us where each student is and what skills they are ready for. Teachers use the data for their lesson plans and it helps them know how to help each student.

School-wide activity--book characters for president. 6 books are being read in classrooms and then a mock election will occur.

We are finalizing an author visit for the school year. We are looking at doing "One Book One School." All families would read the same book and then come together to Skype with the author.
