For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

District students are assigned to Arrowwood Elementary School according to the geographic location of their residence and the grade span for which the building serves. Students may also be assigned to this building for a program offered that better meets their needs. Out-of district students apply through Schools of Choice.

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SPECIALIZED SCHOOLS

Students in the Arrowwood School attendance area may participate in the following specialized programs:

EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT DELAYED

This program offers a classroom for children aged three to five who are developmentally delayed in two or more areas. The children learn basic readiness skills, skills for independence, social skills, and skills to improve their language.

STEP BY STEP PRESCHOOL/CHIDCARE

A fee based Preschool Child Care Program that offers full-day, half-day, and Preschool enrichment only choices, and is available year round or school year. This program serves students ages 3-5.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The 2016-2017 Arrowwood Elementary School Improvement Plan is an official document composed of goals identified through a building comprehensive needs assessment, and outlines building strategies and activities to be implemented to achieve those goals. The School Improvement Team is composed of teachers, parents, and administration, and meets monthly. The team facilitates the continuous collection and analysis of academic assessment data to guide instruction, and evaluates progress of student achievement goals. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF OUR SCHOOL

Since the beginning of the 2010-11 school year, Arrowwood Elementary School serves students in grades third, fourth, and fifth. With an enrollment of approximately 465 students Arrowwood has five sections of grades third through fifth each, totaling fifteen general education classrooms. In addition, Arrowwood accommodates students with disabilities in the area of Autism Spectrum Disorder,

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Cognitively Impaired, and Multi Categorical Resource. We are firmly committed to providing our students with a strong foundation in literacy and numeracy. We have implemented new core curriculum materials in these areas during the past five years. Additionally, we routinely use benchmark assessments to monitor the progress of our students as they develop the skills and knowledge necessary to meet state standards.

CORE CURRICULUM

Our core curriculum is fully implemented, and completely aligned to meet the Michigan Department of Education's adopted learning standards and graduation requirements.
