For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Weiss Elementary has not been identified with one of the above labels.

District students are assigned to Weiss School according to the geographic location of their residence and the grade span for which the building serves. Students may also be assigned to this building for a program offered that better meets their needs or if they enroll through the School of Choice program.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The Weiss Elementary School Improvement Plan is an official document composed of goals identified through a building comprehensive needs assessment, as well as strategies implemented to achieve those goals. The School Improvement Team is composed of teachers, a parent, and an administrator, which meets monthly. The team facilitates the continuous collection and analysis of academic assessment data to guide instruction and evaluate progress of student achievement goals. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF OUR SCHOOL

Weiss Elementary serves students in third, fourth, and fifth grades. With an enrollment of approximately 360 students, there are twelve general education classrooms. In addition, Weiss also provides a special education program for students with multi-categorical disabilities and also a program for emotionally impaired students. Students also receive instruction from one physical education teacher, one art teacher, and one music teacher. Qualifying students can receive services from one of two Literacy Numeracy Specialists. This year a new Literacy

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Specialist has been added to the staff to help support the third grade reading law. Two school social workers are available part-time for both special education students and students who qualify under specific categories. State licensed afterschool daycare, as well as before and after-school student supervision is provided.

CORE CURRICULUM

A copy of our district's core curriculum may be obtained from the STCS Office of Learning, Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment. Our core curriculum is fully implemented, and completely aligned to meet the Michigan Department of Education's adopted learning standards and graduation requirements.
