

registration | Registrations are on a first-come first-serve basis. Preregistration paid in full is required for class participation. Adult classes are open to everyone age 18 and older.

confirmations | Once registration is completed, participants will only be notified if a class is cancelled or changed. If you are not notified in advance, it means the class will be held as scheduled.

waiting list | When a class reaches capacity, participants will be placed on a waiting list. People on the waiting list will be contacted in the order of the waiting list if space becomes available.

refunds | FULL refunds will be made if the class is cancelled by Community Education. Community Education is a self-supporting program. Classes cannot be run at a deficit. ALL refunds must be requested at least 3 week days before the start of a class. A \$4 processing fee will be charged for dropped classes. Non-credit card refunds will be paid by check within 21 days.



Level 5: at a minimum, easily swim the front & back crawl 2 LENGTHS
Level 6: at a minimum, easily swim the front & back crawl 4 LENGTHS
Level 7: at a minimum, easily swim the front & back crawl 4 LENGTHS of the pool, plus swim breaststroke and sidestroke
Level 8: at a minimum, easily swim the front & back crawl 8 LENGTHS of the pool, plus swim breaststroke, sidestroke, and butterfly.



COMMUNITY EDUCATION K-5 AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES CLUBS (ASAC)



Each STCS Elementary school has an ASAC that is open until 6 pm. There are two daily pickup rates: by 5 pm and by 6 pm. Each ASAC center is open on half-days of school, and all students may attend at Arrowwood Center on full-days of no school. All students **must be pre-registered** at least 2 days prior to the first attendance date. Forms are available online at www.stcs.org > Departments > Community Education > After School Activities Club. Each form can be printed out, completed, and returned to the Community Education office. There is a \$25 registration fee for an individual student; \$30 for a family. Each center is licensed by the Department of Human Services, Childcare Licensing.

The Weekly Schedule and Payment form must be returned, with payment, at each of your individual child's center by 6 pm Thursday the week before attending. If online scheduling and payment is used, you will have until Sunday of that same week. There is a \$1.75 convenience fee to use online scheduling and payment.

Rates: Pickup by 5 pm - \$7.80/day; Pickup by 6 pm - \$9.80/day; Half Days - \$10.30 + Pickup time; Full Days - \$27.20

If you will be applying for childcare payments through the DHS Direct Payment Program, please begin this process as soon as possible so it is complete before the first day of the program (September 3). Full payment is required until the eligibility confirmation letter is received from the State of Michigan DHS department. We do not back-bill.

Pre-Paid **EZ-Passes** are also available for those who use the program on a periodic basis and have pre-registered their child. EZ-Passes must be purchased at least one day prior to attendance. Passes may be purchased at Community Education (797-1847). EZ-Passes are good to have on hand in case of an emergency. Rates are **after school days:** \$12.30 (can be used for any after school day); **special days:** half days of school - \$23.30; Full day no school - \$27.40.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB for WHITE PINE STUDENTS

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This club will be open after school until 6 pm each full day school day. Mackinaw High School Food and Clothing Pantry

Prior to the start of the 2018-19 school year, staff at Mackinaw High School organized and implemented the Mackinaw Market. The Mackinaw Market is a free food and clothing pantry for current Mackinaw students and their immediate households. Mackinaw's staff and other volunteers open the Market on the last Friday of each month of school. On average, about 30 different Mackinaw families attended the event. Most families took home enough food for 3-5 days. "It was great to see our families walk out of the Market with carts full of food," said Alan Kern Principal at Mackinaw High School. "The goal of Mackinaw High School is to help our students grow and graduate high school, but it can be hard for students to focus when they are worried about being hungry. So we started this program and we secured funding from the Saginaw Township Community Schools Foundation. "We are thankful to the other schools in Saginaw Township for running food drives. We connected with Hidden Harvest and the Eastern Michigan Food Bank to gather the food and resources needed to make this happen," Kern said. The Market will be open again this coming school year to current Mackinaw students. Over the course of the school year, the Market gathered and gave away approximately \$7000 worth of food and clothing to their students and immediate households!

Open TechTime - new format

STCS Elementary After-School Pick-up Open TechTime Program!

Open TechTime is an after school pickup-up program, giving parents enough time to pick up one child (picking up Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grade students first) and then getting to the 2nd elementary school to pick up siblings. **Open TechTime** is held in Arrowwood, Hemmeter, and Weiss computer labs. **Students with siblings have preference.**

Students must be pre-registered and there is a **\$25 Registration Fee** (new this school year)

If students are in 3-5th grades and have a younger sibling at a different STCS elementary school, there is no monthly fee for **Open TechTime**. The student must be listed as a sibling in the school Skyward system. Students must be picked up no later than 3:10 pm.

For 3- 5th grade students who do not have siblings at a different STCS elementary school, or 3 - 5th grade students who choose to stay later, **Open TechTime** will be open until 3:45 pm each school day (or 1 hour after school ends on half-days). Students will have access to technology devices they bring, access to programs on the school's computers, or can just hangout. A monthly program pass is \$40 (\$30 in December and \$20 in June).

For those wanting to purchase discounted passes, the September - January pass is \$180. For a September - June (school year) pass, the fee is \$350.

Monthly payments are due the first school day of each month at the Community Education office, over the phone (797-1847) with a credit card, or online at www.celighthouse.org. Please do not pay at the school.
