## A Message from our Superintendent

It's hard to believe the 2022-2023 school year has come to an end. I would personally like to recognize the incredible work of our teachers, staff and administrators who made this another successful year for our students.

This year, 315 students have earned their high school diplomas from STCS. These students have an exciting future

ahead as they finalize plans to enter college, a trade school, the military, or the workforce.

Because of our commitment to continual improvement this year, we have many ongoing projects moving the district forward including:

- The hiring of 8 new teachers and a social worker just this month;
- Receipt of a grant through the Michigan Department of Education for safety upgrades throughout the district. We will consult with the Saginaw Township police on safety recommendations;
- Facility upgrades including White Pine Middle School parking lots and Heritage High School's student center along with new flooring and paint in the main commons area.
- Adoption of new curriculum including K-12 grade math and 9-12 grade science.

We still have some things to work on to improve the learning environment for our students. In May, voters rejected a bond proposal to address safety concerns and improve all school facilities to support the educational program. While the bond proposal was not successful, the facility needs did not go away. During the coming weeks, we will continue to analyze the election results. We also want to hear from you regarding what you liked and didn't like about the May bond proposal, and your ideas to address facility needs as we move forward. To get your input, residents will be invited to share their thoughts on addressing facility needs by participating in an online survey. Your comments and suggestions will be used to develop framework to bring another bond proposal back to the community. I hope you will take the time to share your ideas with us. Once that survey is available, we will share the link via email, social media and the STCS website.

In the meantime, there are numerous projects throughout the district that we will be working on over the summer. By utilizing some of the ESSER funds, we will continue with our new playground project with installation at 5 elementary schools, including pre-school playgrounds at 2 of our buildings. Sinking funds will allow us to install 7 boilers, a new roof over the Hemmeter Elementary gym, as well as a new roof over the 7<sup>th</sup> grade building at White Pine Middle School. We are also installing lights on the White Pine Middle School football field, adding blacktop for basketball and 4-square games and adding a walking path and outdoor classroom and garden. Our Nutrition Services will receive kitchen upgrades throughout the district.

In closing, we have a lot to be proud of every day in Saginaw Township Community Schools. We invite you to visit our website for district information and to follow our Facebook, Twitter and Instagram pages to see all of the fun and educational learning going on every day at STCS!

## SIGN UP FOR BUSSING FOR NEXT SCHOOL YEAR BY JULY 1<sup>ST</sup>!

- 1. **Do I have to sign up for bussing each year?** Yes! Situations change, families move, etc. Our Transportation Department re-sets their routes each year and signing up ensures the correct counts for bussing.
- 2. When do I need to sign up for Transportation, for the following school year? By July 1<sup>st</sup>! It seems early, but our routes have to be almost complete and ready to be sent out for bid by August 5<sup>th</sup>! That gives our transportation department just a little over a month to complete each route. Your help with this is invaluable! Sign up is also available for Saginaw Career Complex and special needs students.
- 3. Where do I find my student's bus information? Skyward Family Access has everything you need to know under the 'Bussing' tab.
- 4. When will the bussing information be released in Skyward for 23-24? August 18, 2023
- 5. Who do I call if I have a bussing issue? Please call the Transportation Department, not the school, at 989-799-1885. Their hours are 4:30 a.m.-6 p.m.
- 6. When do I need to be at the bus stop? 7 minutes prior to the pickup time. Our drivers make every effort to be as close to the pickup time as possible.
- 7. Does an adult have to be present for pick-up or drop-off? For all students that are Pre-K through 1<sup>st</sup> grade, there <u>must</u> be a parent present at pick-up AND drop-off. If not, your child cannot be picked up or dropped off.
- 8. **Can my student ride to a friend's house?** Unfortunately, no. The busses have a specific amount of students in the system and we are responsible for each child to get to the correct spot, each day.




